



The Leads were taken on a little tour of the farm. Around this time, they were assigned to help clean the quail's old cage and straws (a type of grass used in the animal pens). After completing the task, the tour continued. They got the chance to see a few greenhouses. This was our first volunteering event at the Snipes farm & hope to get more opportunities in the coming months.
